GMW Graduate Authors Engaging Children's Book

JASMINE HENDRICKSON earned an associate in science degree in 2015 from NEIT's Graphics, Multimedia and Web Design program. She studied Graphic Design at Bermuda College before enrolling at NEIT. Jasmine's book uses visual pop-up artwork for children to embark on a journey through the Bermuda Aquarium, Museum and Zoo (BAMZ). Readers learn about the animals living at the facility such as flamingos, fish and lemurs using pop-up artwork. Jasmine chose to write about the BAMZ since it plays a cultural and historical part of life in Bermuda.

"One day, the Bermuda Aquarium came to mind as something that would be such an interesting topic for pop-up designs," stated Jasmine. "After that, the words just came to me and then transpired into an extensive creative thought! I have always loved pop-up books, and always thought of learning more about them and creating my own. I love illustration and design, not just as a one-dimensional form of art. Pop-up books are one of the greatest ways to portray this multi-dimensional side of arts and crafts. The artists and readers then have a way of seeing flat illustrations come to life, with

All you need is a goal followed by perseverance, determination and love in your heart."

Automotive Student Finds Comfort in Restoring Antique Cars

JESSICA "CHRIS" KENYON has a great story to tell. She is a fourth term student in NEIT's associate in science degree program in Advanced Automotive with High Performance and maintains an exceptional 4.0 GPA. Chris is also an Army veteran who served overseas as an Apache helicopter crew chief and was honorably discharged after an injury. She intended to return to military life, but during recovery she worked with other current and former service members and later decided to take a different road and serve in a veteran services capacity. Dealing with PTSD, a history nerd and wanting a project to work on while earning her degree, Chris searched for something to help her through her challenges. She found it in a 1951 Chrysler Windsor Deluxe which she is proudly restoring.

Chris purchased the car in late August and began work almost immediately. She stated, "I've been steadily cleaning it and uncovering any issues. So far there are very few problems that I didn't know about. The only aftermarket part on it is a fuel pump which I'll be replacing, returning it to its original state or to a working pump that's era appropriate. The car is getting slowly disassembled and cleaned. I've been lucky to find mostly functioning and solid parts. I had the wheels sandblasted, painted them and found clean original hubcaps. I'm replacing the fuel filter and rebuilding the carburetor this term in my Fuels and Ignition class. I have been very lucky that Mr. (Bob) Kennedy, Department Chair of the Transportation Technology program, and many other instructors have allowed me the freedom and space in the automotive lab to work on the car as long as my class work is done."

There is still more work to be completed but the car does run. Chris views refurbishing it as a labor of love. She plans to seek assistance from students and faculty to help her restore as much as they can in their areas of expertise. The interior, the chrome and paint may have to be outsourced, but that is yet to be determined. Chris stated, "When it's 'done'

it could be sold but I'm inclined to use it to raise awareness for veteran service needs. Maybe I'll take it to shows, not to impress anyone, but I do hope it catches people's eyes for that reason. Honestly it may never be 'done enough' for me, and I'll always be tinkering with something on it."

Chris feels a sense of accomplishment, a measurable result of the work done, even if it is fixing a simple part, cleaning the vehicle or improving its overall appearance and functionality. "These things for me, make a difference on dark days. Even looking forward to the next portion of the project, researching and finding parts...it's all helpful and distracts from the demons, most of the time. It's also nice to see something come back from the edge of a junkyard, not that this one was quite there. To bring it back to life is a nice reminder that maybe even I can recover too and eventually help others in the process."

Chris plans to pursue her Bachelor of Science in Business Management once she completes her associate degree. She plans to start her career as an automotive technician and work her way up to a managerial position. Chris would like to combine her passions of working with veterans and restoring more

The virtual ceremony featured winning designs from 14 categories. The student competition consisted of entries from various colleges and universities throughout New England. The criteria included submission of a project within the last year that included floor plans, reflected ceiling plans, finishes and materials, furniture selection, and renderings

Mya's project titled, "The Sterling Hotel" was inspired by Providence's rich history of jewelry manufacturing and silversmithing. The hotel concept is seven stories high and features a grand lobby, event space, restaurant and more than 300 guest rooms. Each space in the hotel was inspired by a different product from Gorham Silver Manufacturing Company, a staple of Providence's manufacturing history.

"What makes me so passionate about interior design is the ability to tell a story and evoke feelings through the overall atmosphere of the space," stated Mya. "I have experienced a handful of spaces that gave me such a memorable and magical feeling when I walked into them, and I strive to recreate those feelings in my designs."

For winning first place, Mya was awarded a cash prize, free membership to IIDA for one year, and a trip to Chicago to attend NeoCon June 14-16, 2021. NeoCon is the world's leading platform and most important event for the commercial interior design industry. With a passion for design since he was a young boy, Justin has used the technical knowledge and skills learned at NEIT to build his portfolio and his career as a UI/UX Analyst at Delta Dental of Rhode Island. Charged with the responsibility of creating user-friendly interfaces so individuals can understand the use of technical products, Justin shares his journey with Tech News readers.

What made you decide to attend NEIT?

I toured New England Tech with my graphics class before I graduated from high school. I had visited a few schools in Rhode Island but NEIT stood out the most to me. The program for graphic design seemed to be broad and it really caught my eye. With the courses that were offered such as photography, motion graphics and design, I felt that it was a great fit for me.

Why did you choose your program?

I have always been someone who likes art and design. Ever since I was a child, I would always try to draw new things and improve upon my skill set and creativity. As I got older, I learned more about graphic design and participated in the vocational program at my high school. That decision grew into my desire and passion to do graphic design as my career path, so I chose the Graphics, Multimedia, and Web Design program at NEIT.

What did you do to get started with your career?

To get started in my career, I found a part-time job working with a company designing signage for conventions. This challenged me to not only think about designs looking attractive but being functional as well. These signs were presented to millions of people including high-end doctors and CEOs. Although it may have been a bit scary, I persevered and found that I enjoyed designing this way.

As I learned more in my program and gained additional experience, I became progressively confident in my skillset enough so as to start doing freelance projects. Working as a freelancer gave me the ability to work at my job while gaining more experience doing web design and other design work. Plus, I earned some extra income which was great.

Tell us about your current position.

I currently work as a UI/UX Analyst at Delta Dental of Rhode Island. As a UI/UX designer, the goal is to create user-focused experiences that align with the goals of the project. I use my knowledge of user experience design and the Adobe Creative Cloud to create prototypes for new concepts that would further enhance

user friendliness. I also get to collaborate with project managers and developers to determine the project needs and goals. I'm getting great experience and I really enjoy the work that I do.

What do you feel ultimately prepared you for your position?

I feel that my New England Tech education prepared me for my position at Delta Dental. Without the Graphics, Multimedia and Web Design program, I'm not sure where my career path would have gone. NEIT provided me with the necessary classes to gain knowledge in areas of design that I could have taken to any design job. As I learned more throughout my education and field experience, I started to really hone in on what I wanted to do for my career. After taking classes such as UI/UX Design, Web Design and Mobile Design, I made it my goal to pursue a career in UI/UX.

Do you have any advice for graduates who are just beginning their job search?

For graduates who are just beginning their job search, I would say that owning your skillset and having confidence in yourself is something you should have. Searching for jobs can be very daunting and intimidating in the beginning, but as you apply and interview a few times, it will get easier and you will get better at it. My advice would be to always have confidence that you are educated in your field and you have the knowledge to be in that position.



What can current students do to better prepare themselves for jobs in this field?

For students to better prepare themselves for the field of graphic design, there are two big things that they should try to do. One is to get some experience in the field that can be used to boost your portfolio to the next level. Choose a project you completed and make a case study out of it. Show the thinking process you developed to arrive at your final product. Employers want to see that you know how to create something, but you should also provide a glimpse into the thought process you used during the creation of your piece.

Another big thing is making sure your portfolio stands out. Using real experience, take some time to make your portfolio the best it can be. Put yourself in an employer's shoes and consider how they may view your portfolio.

In Memory of Assistant Professor Ted Egge

EDWIN M. "TED" EGGE, an Assistant Professor in NEIT's Automotive Technology Department, passed away unexpectedly on July 2, 2020. Ted taught engine repair courses for 15 years at NEIT and was well respected by colleagues and students alike. Shortly after his passing, several automotive students approached Transportation Technology Department Chair, Bob Kennedy, to see what options were available to memorialize their beloved instructor.

To honor Ted, the Automotive Engine Repair Lab AC103 was dedicated in his memory. "Ted fostered an inviting environment in the classroom that broke the barriers between teacher and student, making him a great instructor, most notably with new students," stated Kennedy.

Ted also was an avid golfer and participated in the annual NEIT scholarship tournament, the student vs. faculty tournament, and he played every Friday with the New England Tech student golf club.

"Ted and I were very close friends," Kennedy shared. "He was the kind of person that would drop everything and come and help when asked. That attribute made him a great teacher!"

The NEIT community will truly miss Ted – a wonderful instructor, colleague and friend.

Cybersecurity Instructor Assists the R.I. Board of Elections

MIKE TETREAULT, a faculty member in NEIT's master of science degree program in Cybersecurity Defense, is also a U.S. Army Colonel and serves as a high-ranking technology expert with the Rhode Island National Guard. Mike, along with a team of cyber specialists, has played a major role for the past three years with the Rhode Island Board of Elections to protect election technology from cyberattacks.

Since the election in 2016, there have been increased threats across the United States of election interference from foreign entities. Rhode Island elections are no exception.

"We have no political affiliation, no political aspirations, no financial aspirations," stated Mike. "It is literally to just be that citizen soldier and improve things for the good of everybody, and that is our only purpose for being there."

Mike began his military career as a reservist when he entered the National Guard's officer corps over 30 years ago, arriving in the artillery. From primarily weekend duty at the outset of his career, Mike's responsibilities expanded to full-time management of information technology systems and cybersecurity training scenarios for the Rhode Island National Guard.

The Defensive Cyberspace Operations Element, or DCOE, is the team that Mike oversees. The DCOE consists of six specialists who are trained to spot cyber attackers who try to hack into local Department of Defense networks.

Mike and the DCOE team began their security assessment with the Rhode Island Board of Elections in 2017 as they reviewed the election process, current technology and staffing using policies set forth by the Department of Defense and the President. Working in conjunction with the Rhode Island Division of Information Technology, the team's role was to identify strengths and weaknesses but not to directly implement the recommendations themselves.

The state of Rhode Island received \$3 million in federal funding in 2019 which was used to overhaul the voting system. "They took it down and built a new system," reported Mike, "with the latest software, the latest patches."

Next month Mike will be transitioning full-time employment from the Department of Defense to the Department of Homeland Security, Critical Infrastructure and Cybersecurity Agency (CISA) as the first Cyber Security Advisor for Rhode Island.

The NEIT community is proud to have Mike as a valued instructor as he shares his information technology and military expertise with cybersecurity students.
