New England Institute of Technology Students Win First Place at the 76th Annual Society for Advancement of Management International Business Skills Competition

East Greenwich, RI – Dr. Douglas H. Sherman, Provost and Senior Vice President at New England Institute of Technology (NEIT), is pleased to announce that a team of NEIT students were named the Society for Advancement of Management International Collegiate Business Skills Champions in the Associate's Division at the 76th Annual Society for Advancement of Management International Business Conference held via Zoom on March 18-21, 2021. This annual series of competitions dates back more than 40 years and is organized by the Society for Advancement of Management (SAM). The competition provides an opportunity for students to showcase their current skills and helps them to further develop fundamental skills for business success.

The students competed in five business competitions designed to engage them in the application and practice of classroom learning to real-world challenges. The International Collegiate Business Skills Championships [ICBSC] included five events: the Extemporaneous Speech, Business Knowledge Bowl, Business Pitch, Written Case Study, and Presentation Case Study Competitions. Teams are scored by academic and industry professionals who have real-world experience in leadership and management. Team and Individual Awards are recognized by the Society for outstanding performance overall and separately in each competition segment.

In addition, NEIT was recognized as the 2021 Best SAM Chapter (Large Division) in the United States.
